#### "How Amusing"

Did you see the news this morning? In a protracted renegotiation of his contract, which will now pay him \$45 million over the next 4 years, with \$11 million of guaranteed money, Pastor Wilson is back in the pulpit.

What's so funny?

William Barclay wrote (way back in 1971):

"...the world sets its highest value on that which entertains. And it would appear that no one in the world is worth quite so much as a footballer or a film star. What the world is willing to pay for is entertainment; men will pay anything to be amused. There is the strangest parallel with the Roman society of the time when Christianity came into this world. There is no doubt what the Roman world was trying to do. It was trying to escape – to escape from the weariness and the boredom which had it in its grip. Extravagance is always a sign of the desire to escape."

Barclay said, "men will pay anything to be amused." The word "amuse" is very interesting. Usually we think of definition 2 from Webster: "to entertain or occupy in a light, playful, or pleasant manner". But listen to definition 1 – "to divert the attention, so as to deceive".

The root meaning of amuse is to "not muse" – that is, to avoid thinking deeply about anything, and a thoughtless life quickly becomes careless, reckless, and bored.

This isn't a phenomenon isolated to ancient Rome and contemporary western societies – it's really rooted in human nature. St. Augustine knew it well enough, and when he finally stopped – when he had "mused" for some time – he said, "our hearts are restless until they find their rest in Thee, O God."



I think one of the primary functions of the Sabbath – of regular time set aside for ceasing from the frenzy which has become so consuming – is to muse: to think deeply about the things that deserve deep thought, and to do so with the help of Scripture. It's not hard to see the consequences of failing to do so, sometimes in our own lives as well as in society generally.

Ask yourself when was the last time that you were alone without a TV or a radio on; without a book (except perhaps the Bible); without any distraction for even 30 minutes?

Some of you may be able to answer "this morning." If so, excellent – and keep doing it, giving deep thought to those things that deserve it.

If it's hard for you to remember the last time, I'd recommend putting it in your day-planner, on your calendar, or whatever you use as a scheduler, within the next week.

Set aside 30 minutes – get to a place where you won't be disturbed – read a short passage of Scripture – and muse.

I think you'll like what you find.

#### SABBATH SUPPORT GROUP!



#### Constitution rewrite

Discussion about proposed changes to St. John's Current Constitution Chapter 2, Confession of Faith. Suggestions were made and Pastor Ben will bring edits to the August meeting.

#### Music Director

Discussion about using some for the Frenning Trust to pay a music director to lead the various choirs. Good discussion over the needs of the church.

#### Safety Council Meeting

Will seek funds from the city of Stacy to help with funding trauma kits since we are their emergency evacuation site.

BCA background checks will cost \$12 per person if they are not Chicago County residents. Derek is going to research some other options before moving forward.
